June 27, 2013 Adams County Council of Government Meeting Now that we have the Financing Fire Services report:

The fire funding study, sponsored by COG and ACVESA, was a joint effort to provide Adams County municipalities the information needed for each entity to determine how they would provide equitable funding to their respective fire companies. This tool provided the background information needed for each municipality to determine the method they might use to reach this level.

It is important to remember that the scope of this study was equitable funding. To this end, keep in mind, that on their fundraising drives, our local fire departments only receive donations from approximately 25% of their residents. Therefore, the majority of residents are receiving "a free ride".

The recommendation of the study was an across the board .25 mill tax. That method would mean that all property owners would pay the same rate, based on their assessed value determined by Adams County. If one were to adopt a fire tax, the money generated would by law be dedicated only for the fire companies, and proportionate based on the primary due area into the respective municipality.

Disbursement of tax dollars must be accountable.

That takes us to the next point. A small group is currently meeting, to determine forms that would work for both municipalities and fire companies. This group includes fire department administrators, as well as municipal officials. This will provide information regarding accepted operational costs, time lines for disbursement, and suggestions. Recommendations will come out of this group.

What has become evident to those of us who have worked on this project is the need for the municipalities to sit down with their respective fire companies, and work out a MOU. We have the legal responsibility to provide for the health and safety of our residents, and the fire company is the delivery mechanism for that. We must work together to that end. Be it a resolution or an ordinance, each municipality should work with their solicitor

Talking with residents it becomes apparent that although no one likes to hear of tax increase, however, once they understand that a fire tax would be dedicated to fire service, and would appear on their tax bill independently, they are in favor as long as there is accountability. They too want to retain their volunteers and respect their service. If we all work together on the administrative disbursements of .25 mill dollar amounts we will be much stronger in bringing about the intent of equitable funding.

We would encourage you to set up meetings with your respective fire departments at your workshops to begin discussions.

The position of this COG has always been, we will provide information. How each member handles this information, is entirely up to each individual body.

Informational forms are being handled out to assist you in the contacts for setting up meetings.

TO HELP FACILITATE COMMUNICATION AND COLLABORATION BETWEEN THE FIRE DEPARTMENTS AND THE MUNICIPALITIES THEY SERVE.

In 2008, the Borough and Township Code had a significant change. The law changed to say that municipalities "shall" be responsible for fire and emergency medical services. We cannot assume that the people and property within our municipalities are protected. We have to know that we are doing everything we can to ensure that the volunteer departments remain solvent and able to provide emergency services within our municipalities.

We are very fortunate to have the services of our departments and volunteers, but they need our financial help. Please make the effort to communicate and collaborate with each other.

→ Message to Fire Departments:

Please go to your municipal officials and request to have an informational workshop with the elected officials to discuss the Financing Fire Services study. It is important that the municipalities and the fire departments communicate and have the opportunity to hear the same questions and answers.

You will find attached the contact information including the phone number and address for all the municipalities. Also the typical time a monthly meeting is held so you can work it into your schedule.

→ Message to Boroughs and Townships:

Please contact your first due departments and request they come and meet with your elected officials. The benefit of having both the municipality and department(s) in the same room is the opportunity to discuss common concerns, ask and answer questions so everyone is hearing the same thing.
