

Commissioners announce second application cycle for the Adams County Opioid Settlement Funds Grant Program

Gettysburg, PA - Wednesday, March 18, 2026 – The Adams County Commissioners approved the opening of another application cycle of the Opioid Settlement Funds Grant Program. The application cycle will open Wednesday, April 1, 2026, and run through Friday, June 12, 2026.

The Adams County Board of Commissioners authorized the creation of this grant program initiative in 2025 to further combat the opioid epidemic and support the recovery efforts of individuals and families experiencing the effects of OUD throughout the County. This grant program will support evidence-based and community-driven initiatives that prevent opioid misuse and expand access to recovery and treatment programs throughout the County. The County program is funded through the receipt of Opioid Litigation Settlement Funds administered by the Pennsylvania Opioid Misuse and Addiction Abatement Trust, which receives funds from settlements entered into by opioid manufacturers, distributors, and retail pharmacy chains.

Eligible applicants for this grant program include non-profit organizations, government entities, and community-based groups that propose special projects directly aligned with opioid abatement strategies. Projects must qualify under one or more of the approved opioid abatement uses approved by the Court and referenced here [Exhibit E – List of Opioid Remediation Uses](#).

The County will accept applications beginning Wednesday, April 1, 2026, through close of business (4:30pm) on Friday, June 12, 2026. Applications may be sent electronically to acosf@adamscountypa.gov or submitted in person at the Commissioners' Office on the second floor of the Adams County Courthouse located at 117 Baltimore Street, Room 201, Gettysburg, PA 17325 during regular courthouse business hours.
