ELECTION UPDATE

Election Deadlines Approaching

With the November 8th General Election just around the corner, residents wishing to register or vote by mail/absentee must meet fast approaching deadlines. Here are the deadlines and some other election reminders.

- The last day to register to vote is October 24th
- The last day to apply for mail-in/absentee is November 1st
- The last day for County Board of Elections to receive the voted ballot is November 8th at 8:00pm. Ballots
 received by mail in the Elections Office after 8PM election day will not be counted. The date of postmark
 is not a factor. The ballot must be in the office by 8PM election day!
- In order to apply for an absentee or mail-in ballot, you must supply proof of identification. Read the instructions carefully and mark your ballot. Be sure to complete the front and back of each page. Seal your ballot in the inner secrecy envelope that indicates "official election ballot." Do not make any marks on the inner secrecy envelope. Your ballot must be enclosed and sealed in the inner secrecy envelope that indicates "official election ballot" or it will not be counted. Seal the inner secrecy envelope in the preaddressed outer return envelope. Complete the voter's declaration on the outside of the outer return envelope. If you do not complete the declaration on the return envelope your ballot will not be counted.
- Voters cannot drop off ballots for family members or friends. Each voter must return his or her own ballot. Voters with a disability can have someone return the ballot for them, but it must be designated in writing. Emergency ballots are available to voters who have an unexpected illness or disability or a last-minute absence from their municipality.

New Wayside Sign at Sachs Mill Bridge

Through the generosity of the Gettysburg Battlefield Preservation Association & The Daniel Lady Farm, a new sign for the interpretative wayside exhibit on the Cumberland Township side of the bridge has been installed. The new sign was installed on Wednesday by Adams County Building & Maintenance to replace the old, faded sign. Hats off and thank you to GBPA for being proactive and generous in preserving and interpreting our Adams County history, especially at this significant and beloved Adams County landmark!

IT Update

The Information Technology Department is continuing to prepare for the changeover to the new Adams County website. Remaining data migrations on both County and Municipal sites are being finalized as the project moves forward. The domain change from adamscounty.us to adamscountypa.gov for the County website and email will occur on the same go-live date. Domestic Violence

Violence Proclamations Take Center Stage at Commissioners' Meeting

WARENESS MONTH

At Wednesday's meeting the Board recognized October as *Domestic Violence*Awareness Month in Adams County. Domestic violence remains a pervasive issue across Adams County, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and the United States with one in three women and one in four men in the United States having experienced some form of physical violence by an intimate partner. Research shows creating communities where people are connected, supportive and care for one another can reduce incidents of domestic violence. Every day in Adams County individuals and organizations play a part in supporting people that domestic violence impacts by providing therapeutic, legal, educational, housing advocacy, and medical services. The proclamation was sponsored and presented by the Gettysburg YWCA.

Week Without Violence was presented by the Hanover YWCA. The proclamation related that Violence against women impacts the lives of countless women and their families across the United States. One in four women experiencing domestic violence and more than three women are murdered each day by their current or former partner in communities across the country. One of every four homeless women is homeless because of violence committed against her, and over 92% of homeless mothers have experienced severe physical and/or sexual abuse during their lifetime. The proclamation urged the Adams County community to work to end the epidemic of gender-based violence and support families, supporting survivors so that together, we can end gender-based violence.

Adams County Master Gardener Program Success Story

In a previous TGIF, I featured Adams County's Master Gardener program and explained the benefits of the program and how to become a Master Gardener. Here is a very positive follow-up to that feature:

The Master Gardener Coordinator has been reaching out to the underserved community for programing opportunities. An individual from the Adams County Rescue Mission (ARM) asked about becoming a Master Gardener. The Master Gardner program provided the individual with a full scholarship, and after the sixmonth training the individual graduated in the spring of 2022. The individual used the training to obtain employment at Quality Greenhouse, a large commercial greenhouse operation, located just north of York Springs. This greenhouse now supplies free plant material to sell at the ARM. The individual secured housing and no longer lives upstairs at ARM. The manager for the thrift shop at ARM spoke about how this opportunity benefited the individual and our community. It is great to share this success story with you!
