AND NOW, this 27<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2013, in order to incorporate the amendment created by Act 204 of 2012 to the Juvenile Act that would require the Court of Common Pleas to grant leave to allow military recruiters and other government-related law enforcement agencies to inspect juvenile records held by the minor judiciary, and in order to improve the efficiency for the Department of Probation Services, Juvenile Division to provide information to the same aforementioned institutions, the following shall apply.

Pursuant to 42 Pa.C.S. § 6307(a)(7), the Court hereby recognizes military recruiters and other government-related law enforcement agencies as having a legitimate interest in the proceedings of the unified judicial system and authorizes the minor judiciary of Adams County to permit the inspection of juvenile records when accompanied by a consent form signed by the juvenile for whom the record pertains. In the absence of a signed consent form, the request for juvenile records will be forwarded to the Court of Common Pleas through Court Administration for review. This procedure will also apply for requests made to the Adams County Department of Probation

1 Services, Juvenile Division and is applicable only to those probation files as  
2 defined in Rule 120 of the Pennsylvania Rules of Juvenile Court Procedure.

3 This Order shall take effect immediately.
