The meeting was called to order by President Laughman at 8:30 a.m.

A motion was made by Comm. Phiel and seconded by Vazquez (Biglerville) to approve the May 2021 meeting minutes as presented. Motion carried.

Treasurer Smith presented the treasurers report with no changes. The balance remains at \$7494.26. Insurance invoices will due shortly.

A motion was made by Gordon (Hamiltonban) and seconded by Comm. Phiel to approve the Treasurer's report as presented. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

There is bridge work being done on Mummasburg Rd. near the new WWII museum. There is quite a lengthy detour.

REGULAR BUSINESS

- A. Adams County Commissioners: Comm. Phiel commented that the Commissioners meetings have moved back to public session every two weeks but will continue to provide the meetings virtually. The Courthouse is open except for Court. Persons needing to attend court must contact the Court

Administrator and to visit the Public Defender's office persons must have an appointment. The Redding site/Gettysburg Station, after 15 years, has been sold. Comm. Phiel is hopeful that good news will be coming for Oak Lawn Memorial Gardens. The County is beginning to work on the 2022 budget. Negotiations with unions has begun. There is a labor crisis especially in Corrections. Higher wages may be needed to entice new employees.

B. Legislative Representatives:

Cathleen Wallen (Rep. Ecker) commented the Budget passed the end of June. Their office is dealing with the Unemployment issues. Rep. Ecker tries to attend local carnivals and national night out. Mentioned the major road project at the intersection of route 94 and route 234.

Ashleigh Presnar (Cong. Joyce) introduced herself. Congressman Joyce was recently appointed to the Healthy Future Task Force, which aims to solve health care issues.

C. Adams County Office of Planning and Development: Andy Merkel present information about Grant programs, CBDG applications are being accepted now. Parks and Rec. applications open August 1. Kelly, Ellen and Bicky can help with these. Recently rolled out the payment of review fees online. They are working on future trainings for Municipalities. Specifically, SALDO. The Long-Range Transportation Plan is due one year from this date. A survey will be released online. The ACOPD is asking that you put this survey link on your web site if you have one.

D. Township Officials Association: Gordon (Hamiltonban) mentioned the secretary luncheon will be held on Sept 29 at the EMS. The tentative date for the Township's annual convention is November 10, 2021, at SAVES. Info will be mailed shortly.

If Boosters are required, the EMS building may be off limits in the future. Barb Underwood and Comm. Phiel are 2 of 3 committee members for AREMS. Eric Zaney has taken a job and oversees Penn State Hershey's Life Lion operations. Mike Smith is the interim operations manager for AREMS. Gordon commented ARMES is doing well.
