must file their notice to appeal by August 1 to be heard that year, for the

changed results to take effect the following year. The Board began to hear Commercial, Exempt,

Catastrophic Loss and Clean & Green appeals this past Wednesday. Those appeal hearings will continue this month.

Residential appeals are being heard by an experienced auxiliary board appointed by the commissioners. All appeals must be heard by October 31 and Board's decisions must be made by November 15. All appellants have the right to appeal the Board decision to the Court of Common Pleas.

This year we have 106 total appeals scheduled. Compare that to over 10,000 appeals after the reassessment in 2010! They breakdown as follows:

Commercial/Industrial Appeals: 13

Tax Exemption Requests: 26

Clean and Green related Appeals: 9

Catastrophic Loss Appeals: 3 Residential/Farm Appeals: 55

On another tax related note, this year Tax Claim Sales are on September 26 and bidder pre-registration must be done, in-person, by September 16 to be eligible to bid at the sale!

### 911 Maintenance Agreement

As the Adams County Board of Commissioners, we have no greater responsibility than the safety and protection of our residents. In providing that service the 911 call center does come with a hefty price tag! At the public meeting on September 3rd, we authorized Dauphin County, as the fiduciary and fiscal agent of the South-Central Inter-County Communications Network (SCICNET), of which the County is a member, to approve the Multi-year Maintenance and SUA II Agreement – SCICNET Master & DSR from Motorola Solu-

In plain English, this agreement provides for maintenance and life cycle services for the SCICNETowned components of the ASTRO 25 radio system. The term of the Agreement is six (6) years, commencing on October 1, 2026, and terminating September 30, 2032. Pursuant to Resolution No. 6 of 2025, the County is responsible for 25% of the total cost of this agreement. Total cost to the County for the 6year agreement is \$2,551,811.
