Performance Measures for Adams County


MAP-21 and FAST Act established a series of performance measures for State DOT's and MPO's to work towards.

- Safety (PM-1) Last adopted on January 26, 2022 (Adopt yearly)
 - PM-1 measures how safe the transportation network is for users.
 - 1. Number of Fatalities
 - 2. Rate of Injuries
 - 3. Number of Serious Injuries
 - 4. Rate of Serious Injuries
 - 5. Number of non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries
- Pavement and Bridge Conditions (PM-2) Adopted on October 31, 2018; Updated January 27, 2021 (Adopt every 4 years)
 - PM-2 measures the condition of the transportation network.
 - Assess the condition of the Interstate and National Highway System (NHS) pavements and bridges.
- System Performance (PM-3) Adopted on October 31, 2018; Updated January 27, 2021 (Adopt every 4 years)
 - PM-3 measures the performance of the system (or the lack thereof).
 - Assess the level of reliability and congestion of the transportation network.

Performance Measures for Adams County

- Greenhouse Gas Emissions Performance Measure
 - On December 7, 2023, FHWA published a final rule amending 23 CFR 490, establishing a greenhouse gas (GHG) performance measure as part of Transportation Performance Management. [23 CFR 490.105(c)(5)] [88 FR 85364]
 - The GHG performance measure is the percent change in tailpipe Carbon Dioxide (CO2) emissions on the National Highway System (NHS) compared to the reference year of calendar year 2022. [§ 490.507(b)].
 - Targets established for the GHG performance measure shall be declining targets for reducing tailpipe CO2 emissions on the NHS. [§ 490.105(e)(10) and (f)(1)]
 - The GHG Final Rule applies to State departments of transportation (DOTs) and metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs).
 - The GHG Final Rule does not change any of the reporting requirements or timelines for the other 17 TPM measures in 23 CFR part 490.
 - State DOTs will first establish targets by February 1, 2024. Starting in 2026, and every 4 years thereafter, State DOTs will establish 2-year and 4-year targets for this measure and will report biennially by October 1st of each even year. [§§ 490.105 and 490.107(b)].
- However, on March 27, 2024, a federal court ruled in a case brought by the State of Texas that the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) is not authorized to regulate greenhouse gas (GHG) or GHG emissions via the December 2023 rulemaking.

What Urbanized Areas Require GHG Targets?





HSIP- Highway Safety Improvement Program- Federal Funds directed towards projects that will implement measures to reduce or prevent.

BOF- Bridge Off System- Federal Funds to be utilized on bridges that are not on the Federal Aid System and the bridge is greater than 20 feet.

TAP/TAU- Transportation Alternative Program- Federal Funds primarily focused on Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvements. TAU is the TAP funding allocated to MPO's with a population greater than 200,000.



PLAN HIGHLIGHTS

Overview

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) established the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) discretionary program with **\$5 billion in appropriated funds over 5 years, 2022-2026.** The SS4A program funds regional, local, and Tribal initiatives through grants to prevent roadway deaths and serious injuries.

The SS4A program supports the U.S. Department of Transportation's National Roadway Safety Strategy and their goal of zero roadway deaths using a Safe System Approach. The Borough of Gettysburg in Adams County, Pennsylvania is advancing the **Gettysburg Action Plan; a \$150,000 plan** that will evaluate historic downtown Gettysburg in support of the U.S. DOT's National Roadway Safety strategy and goal of zero roadway deaths. The goal of an Action Plan is to develop a holistic, well- defined strategy to prevent roadway fatalities and serious injuries. **A successful plan will include the following eight key components:**

- Leadership Commitment and Goal Setting an official public commitment to an eventual goal of zero reoadway fatalities and serious injuries.
- 2. Planning Structure a committee or task force charged with oversight of plan development and implementation.
- **3. Safety Analysis** an analysis of exisiting conditions and historical trends that provide a baseline level of crashes.
- 4. Engagement and Collaboration robust engagement with the public and relevant stakeholders that allows for representation and feedback.
- Equity plan development using inclusive and representative processes.
- Policy and Process Changes assessment of current policies, plans, guidelines, and/or standards to identify opportunities to improve.
- 7. Strategy and Project Selections identification of a comprehensive set of projects and strategies shaped by data and feedback that will address safety problems identified in plan.
- 8. Progress and Transparency method to measure progress over time after the Action Plan is developed.

FY24 SS4A Request

The Borough is requesting \$120,000 in SS4A grant funding. The Borough has committed \$30,000 in matching funds. These funds will be used to develop the Action Plan and begin implementation of strategies and projects identified.

Plan Timeline

Plan development will begin immediately upon award (expected by Summer or Fall 2024) and will take a year to complete.



Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside (TASA)

<u>Overview</u>

Fiscally constrained program of transportation improvements

- Partners include Metropolitan & Rural Planning Organizations
- 1st four years of the Twelve-Year Program (TYP)
- Updated every other year
- Multimodal includes all modes highways, bridges, public transit, aviation, rail & bike/ped

Transportation Infrastructure & Investment Fund (TIIF)

A reserve of \$25 million per year in state funds set aside for transportation improvements aimed at improving Pennsylvania's transportation system related to economic development opportunities. Decisions on how to utilize this funding are at the discretion of the Governor and/or the Secretary of Transportation.

Marcellus Legacy Fund-Act 13

- Impact fee to the Highway Bridge Improvement Restricted Account in the Motor License Fund
- Used to fund replacement or repair of locally owned (county; municipal), at-risk deteriorated infrastructure
- Fund distributed based on county population (minimum \$40,000)

Multimodal Transportation Fund (MTF)

\$40 million to PennDOT annually, with \$35 million allocated to highway and bridge-related projects and \$5 million available for projects that propose improvements to any mode.

- Awards must be matched by eligible local funding of at least 30% of the amount awarded
- Awards are time limited. Sponsors have one year after accepting award to execute reimbursement agreement, which expires three years after execution
- Applicants should coordinate project scope, purpose, & need with local authorities, planning region, and PennDOT Engineering District prior to application development and submission
- Grants are available for projects with total cost of \$100,000 not to exceed \$3,000,000

- Business/Non-profit
- Economic Development Organization
- Public Transportation Agency
- Ports or Rail/Freight Entity

Qualifying Activities

Funds may be used for the development, rehabilitation & enhancement of transportation assets including:

- streetscapes
- lighting
- sidewalk enhancement
- pedestrian safety
- connectivity of transportation assets
- transit oriented development

Please note that PennDOT's multimodal program is separate from the Multimodal Transportation Fund administered by the Commonwealth Financing Authority.

Redevelopment Assistance Capital Program (RACP)

The RACP is a Commonwealth grant program administered by the Office of the Budget for the acquisition and construction of regional economic, cultural, civic, recreational, and historical improvement projects. Projects should have a regional or multi-jurisdictional impact, and generate substantial increases or maintain current levels of employment, tax revenues, or other measures of economic activity. RACP projects are state-funded projects that cannot obtain primary funding under other state programs.
